FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS

1. How much does this trip cost?

The school collected a trip participation fee at the beginning of the year as part of the “Activity Fee.” Sorry, there are no refunds if your student is unable to attend.

2. Why does Linfield Christian School do this trip?

Our school exists so that students will know Jesus Christ. This trip is another tool which we use to further encourage our students in their pursuit of a relationship with their Savior. It has become a vital part of who we are and what we do with our student body. Students are challenged spiritually by a different speaker each year; they attend seminars presented by different faculty members and meet God through worship in our morning and evening chapels. They also participate in games, activities, and small group times which help them develop stronger bonds with their classmates and teachers. All in all, Winter Mountain provides a great time for our students to get away from every day life to encounter Jesus Christ.

3. Why should my student attend Winter Mountain?

All LCHS students are required and expected to attend Winter Mountain. However, we realize that emergencies arise that may prevent a student from attending (illness, family emergencies, etc.). A student must pick up and fill out an Excused Absence Request form, and return it to the HS attendance office in order to be excused from Winter Mountain. The three days we are gone will count as absences in each class and in their cumulative total for the second semester attendance.

4. What if my student needs medicine or is on medication?

The school nurse is not permitted to dispense prescription or nonprescription medication, including aspirin or Tylenol, without prior written consent from a licensed physician/healthcare provider who has the responsibility for the medical management of the student. Students are not to have any medication in their possession. If your student requires medication for any reason please refer to the “what to bring” list online for specific details.

5. How can I pray for Winter Mountain?

Please pray for the safety of all of the students, faculty, and administration as we travel to and from the camp and as we enjoy the beautiful facilities and the many activities it has to offer. Pray for the main speaker, the various seminar speakers, and for the worship band – that God will speak through them and use them in powerful ways to challenge and inspire the students. Pray for the faculty as they build closer relationships with the students and minister to their needs in small groups – that God will bless these relationships and work in them and through them to reflect His unconditional love. Finally, please pray for the students and ask God to speak to their hearts, to draw them even closer to Him, to inspire in them a desire to live out their faith in a real and dynamic way, and to spark a spiritual revival on the Linfield campus. Thank you for your prayers – they are essential!

6. What kind of clothes and items does my child need to bring?

A “what to bring” list can be found online, but warm and waterproof clothes are essential. Don’t forget waterproof gloves, a beanie, extra socks, and maybe even some thermals and an extra pair of shoes – along with casual winter clothing. DO NOT wear flip flops as we are on hilly terrain and it is cold and sometimes snowy!

Students should also bring some extra spending money (approximately \$20-40) for snack bar and the gift store as well as a water bottle.

7. Are students required to wear Linfield wardrobe items?

No, but school rules for modesty and appropriate dress still apply to all clothing choices.

8. Who is transporting my child up and down the mountain?

Private charter buses will be providing our transportation again this year.

9. What are the sleeping arrangements?

Students are chaperoned by Linfield teachers and staff with a ratio of approximately 12 students to one adult. Please pray for our chaperones!
